

GLAZIER

JOB SUMMARY

Under direction, installs and replaces glass and screening; and performs related work as required.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Installs glass, acrylic, and lexan panes, and/or doors, screening, mirawall, and mirrors in schools, shops, and offices.
- Applies window-tinting materials.
- Measures window and door openings; cuts to measure and installs appropriate materials.
- Replaces glass in cabinets and cases.
- Installs or replaces wood, metal, and vinyl moldings.
- Cuts and installs wood for temporary replacement to assure security and safety at the site.
- Replaces broken panes with glass cut to size.
- Cuts and sands to bevel edges on glass for desktops.
- Maintains an inventory of glass, mirrors, mirawall, and screening.
- Operates wet/dry vacuum, power saws, hammers, sanders, grinders, and a variety of small tools.
- Drives to various district sites.

MARGINAL DUTIES

- Replaces guides and other hardware on windows and doors.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

Education and Experience

High school graduation or equivalent and one year of experience as a journey-level glazier.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of:

- Tools, materials, and standard practices of glazing and simple carpentry.
- Safety practices involved with carrying, climbing, installing, removing, and handling new or broken glass, including assuring the safety of students in the immediate area.

Ability to:

- Use glazing tools and materials appropriately.
- Work from sketches, drawings, and blueprints.
- Follow oral and written instructions.
- Read and write English at a level required for successful job performance.
- Direct the work of others.
- Keep simple work records.
- Work with hazardous materials, including removing broken glass safely.
- Observe safety practices while climbing and lifting.
- Carry a bucket with tools up and down a ladder safely.
- Drives a truck to and from work sites.
- Work cooperatively with others.

LICENSE: Must possess and maintain a valid Class C California Driver License and remain insurable at the standard insurance market rate.

WORKING CONDITIONS: Works primarily outdoors, standing at ground level, from a ladder or from scaffolding to install or remove window panes of various materials and sizes. Works as part of a two-person team to carry and install large panes of glass. Carries up to 50 pounds without assistance. Operates a variety of hand and power tools. Follows appropriate safety precautions in handling broken glass.
